- 1. Wearable Technology
- 2. Coaching and Team Area Decorum
- 3. Denying an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity (DOGSO)
- 4. Substitutions



Rules Revisions

- 1 Once the referee stops the clock and beckons medical professional or coach onto the field, the player must leave the field of play. If a medical professional or coach is not beckoned on, the player does not have to leave the field.
- A player should re-enter the game from the official area at midfield.
- Players should exit the field from the bench side when the substitute(s) is beckoned on by the referee unless the player(s) is unable to do so because of an injury.
- 4. New rule defines how wearable technology may be worn.

- 5. Criteria has been added for deliberately playing the ball when determining an offside infraction.
- 6. Definitions have been developed for "careless and reckless fouls" and "excessive force."
- 7. Neither accidental nor deliberate contact with the hand/arm results in a goal.
- Language has been added to clarify goalkeeper handling not permitted outside and inside the penalty area.
- Griteria has been added that must be present for "Denying an Obvious Goal-Scoring Opportunity" infraction to be called.
